One of the joys of many in the SCA is creating beautiful scrolls recognizing the service, arts, sciences, and martial prowess of members. This gift actually involves a lot of moving parts! Here's a simplified version of the process:

- 1. Their Majesties receive award recommendations
- 2. Event autocrats share attendance lists
- 3. Their Majesties plan awards based on recommendations and attendees at events on Their royal Progress
- 4. Scroll requests are sent to the signet's office
- 5. The Signet works with scribes throughout the kingdom to create and send scrolls back to Their Majesties
- 6. Who recognize the many amazing people of Drachenwald with award and scroll.

In a perfect world, there would always be plenty of time between each of those steps, plenty of scribes, no delayed mail, no missing attendees, etc. Unfortunately, that's not always how it works – and that's when the backlog signet's office comes in to play.

When a reign ends, the Signet's office looks at the list of scroll requests from the reign for any not given out during that reign for whatever reason. That list is then sent to the Backlog Signet's office.

The backlog signet works with scribes who may have scrolls still in process or still in transit, as well as issuing new assignments, to complete scrolls and get them delivered to so many awesome folks in Drachenwald. **But we need your help to do it!**

# Investiture Impressions

Let me tell you about the weekend of the Baronial Investiture, a weekend of large emotions, fun, and vehicular misadventures. The scene for our tale is the Burren Outdoor Adventure Centre, a wonderfully eccentric building nestled into its stone walls, grand sparse mountains and brilliant patches of sheep manicured green.

Joining us were Their Majesties King Sven and Queen Siobhan and Their Highnesses Prince Alexandre and Princess Eularia, and their Excellencies the Barons Cynnabar from the Kingdom of the Middle, and it was a true joy to have them there for the event. There are few things as endearing to the Irish sensibility as the sounds of excellent company clearly having a great time with stories, games and mischief.

But for me the stand out memories are of the pockets of truly affecting emotion at the courts. There are events in our calendars where Court has to play a more significant part of the event than others and Investiture is definitely one of those.

### Alice de la Wode's Countryside Corner





**Hawthorn berries** or haws Cratageus monogyna (the Latin name refers to the single seed/stone within) Good to harvest between now and the end of November. These make a fantastic ketchup when pared with wild spices but, even better than that, they make a very nutritious and delicious fruit leather for which there are lots of recipes online.

**Silverweed** Potentilla anserina the roots of these are really good at this time of year up until the end of October or so. The roots, which are about the thickness of a pencil, are excellent fried tasting very like potato crossed with artichoke. They can also be scrubbed and boiled or steamed. This plant was considered a famine food and its starchy goodness was much valued. I'm sure the same would have true in medieval times.





**Elderberry** Sambucus nigra The berries are ready when dark purple and the bunch droops heavily downwards. The berries need to be stripped from as much of the toxic twiggy material as possible, a fork is good for this. Elderberries need to be heated to drive off the cyanogenic compounds. The juice can be boiled with added sugar to provide a warming tonic that will ward off even the severest of colds and flu. Elderberry wine (with added blackberries) is one of the best country wines. Elderberry vinegar makes for an exceptional, fruity salad dressing.



The Cumann na Sáirsintí program was introduced at Investiture. The following is about Cumann na Sáirsintí, please feel free to ask many questions if any clarification is needed! This program is for all unbelted, all non-peers!

The rank of Sergeant is a unique tradition from the Kingdom of An Tír which began when An Tír was a principality situated a very long way from the Crown of the West. This is similar to the geographical distance of Eplaheimr within the Kingdom of Drachenwald. Historically, candidates for sergeants were tested in all the skills of knighthood such as arts, sciences, warfare, courtly manners, dancing, heraldry, and games. Therefore, when the Crowns of the Kingdom of the West did come to An Tír, they could be assured that these fine gentles were worthy of consideration. The rank of Sergeant has spread throughout the Baronies of An Tír and to some other Kingdoms. The ranks have since evolved to include other areas of interest in the Society.

The ranks for the Barony of Eplaheimr, in line with other programs within the Knowne World, are:



Sáirsint (Sergeant): specialising in heavy weapon fighting.

Scoláire (Courtier/Scholar): specialising in courtly/arts & science skills

Pionsóir (Gallant): specialising in rapier skills

Boghdóir (Yeomen): specialising in war/missile/archery skills

Lansaí (Lancer): specialising in equestrian skills

These ranks have been developed to allow individuals the opportunity to demonstrate martial prowess, commitment to service, pursuit of the arts and sciences, and/or dedication to the chivalric qualities, and developmental ideals esteemed within the Society for Creative Anachronism.

The goal of Cumann na Sáirsintí (the Sergeants) is to provide subject experts within the Barony and throughout the region, who exemplify a commitment of service to the populace of the Barony. These are not honours, they are ranks. This means that they are not given as an award by someone for past work done. Instead, there are a set of tests/trials. If the candidate passes all of the trials, they will receive the rank. If they do not pass one of the tests, they do not receive the rank. The Sáirsint retains this rank until such time as they should become Peer, when they would return the rank and regalia to the Barony. We invite any member of Drachenwald to compete at the trials for the rank of Sáirsint; however, there would be an expectation of fealty, in keeping devotion and loyalty to the Barony of Eplaheimr. Members of Cumann na Sáirsintí are recognised as ambassadors of the Barony. They work with the current Baronial Champions to help foster the skills and ideals of their chosen area of study. They are expected to have devotion to and loyalty to the Barony at large.

Each candidate submits a written (scribed with calligraphy and illumination) request to the Baronial Royalty to enter the trials and be judged by experts in each field. The passing "grade" would ensure the candidate would have to be, for example as a Sáirsint specialising in heavy weapon fighting, a dependable middling or better fighter, but would have to be much better at each of the other, non-fighting skills, than what the requirements for Knighthood demanded. Therefore, when a member with a rank of Sáirsint from Eplaheimr was being discussed by the Peers of Drachenwald they would only have to be concerned with that person's fighting prowess. The fact that he or she was a Sergeant would ensure that all the other requirements had been met and then some. There would be no question that the prospective knight had all the other graces.

The trials are designed to help the candidates improve their knowledge of their chosen specialty/category, and to increase their knowledge of various aspects of history. While the trials are specific, they will show that each candidate has reached a certain level. This is a serious and self-reflective body of work that is very personal to each candidate. They will have from 6 months to one year's preparation. The information will be available to them online, for ease. The final Trialacha Cumann na Sáirsintí (Sergeants Trials) will occur at a weekend event toward the end of the first year after the first Investiture of the new Baronial Royalty (in congruence with the Baronial games) wherein the final tournaments of combat, and arts, courtly graces, and others will be completed and the Sergeants will be made. Many of the trials will be performed over the first year coming up to the Trialacha Cumann na Sáirsintí. There will be a checklist available for the candidates to retain and have signed off during the year to put toward the Trialacha.
