# How long have you played?

15 years wow that long!

# Do you have a preferred Time Period?

My preferred time periods are nearly always associated with food I like to cook. I like six and seventh century Ireland, the Viking hiberno-norse era, Anglo Norman era and 16th century. In reality any Gaelic Irish. When I first joined I took my persona from my Irish maiden surname O'Keeffe as it dates back to 6th century Ireland.

# Do you have any Persona background story?

The women of Eplaheimr took a liking for Italian Renaissance clothes and when I wanted to wear this type of garb I just used the backstory that my brother was a bishop and asked me to accompany him to Italy as a newly widowed sister.

Now I know that my grandparents' names, two are based on Gaelic Irish, one from the Viking era and the other from 16th and 17th century during the plantation. It therefore makes it easy to make a back story for living in Ireland throughout any Irish age. Finally I am confident I can cook for any century so it makes my different personas interesting

# What is your preferred SCA Activity or A&S, or both?

My preferred activity is anything Irish, or The Irish ages.

My interest in Irish stuff has created a keen interest in cooking and Irish archaeology through the ages. I have also developed a substantial library of academia-level books that resides in my sitting room, kitchens, hallways and my van - Irish stuff that I describe as many holes to burrow into a warren but all link together. They include proof of food, fauna and flora that existed in Ireland through the ages, the difference in both before and after the arrival of the new ecclesiastical orders in the 11th century and the Anglo Normans in the 12th century.

My library includes annals, social history, books about plants and herbs, tales and myths of Ireland, court admiralty and trade books. Books based on information from Brehon laws, manuscripts, trade of import and export in and out of Ireland, account rolls, books which are the bibles of how Irish dressed through the ages such as DunLevy and Mc Clintock.. Stories about Saints and scholars, Ceile Dé, which informs us of the types of foods allowed to be eaten during lent, feast days and ordinary days for example.

My favourite myth, Aislinn Meic Coinne Glinn, will allow me to develop at least 100 more feasts. The new papers that colleges have published in the last ten years place emphasis on food, analysis of foods, materiality, trade, the use of food to show power, and it all makes Irish food a very interesting subject area.

# What keeps you coming back to the SCA?

The people, the friendship, and the place that allows me to discover more about myself, develop new and exciting interests. I describe the SCA as a place of 1000 clubs all rolled into one, always something new to be learned or shared.



# What has been your best SCA experience so far?

My best SCA experience is watching others realising they have found a place that allows them to be unique. Watching people evolve and develop interests.

I am proud that I was one of the people who helped Eplaheimr achieve Baronial status, But one of my best experiences was becoming Seneschal, but probably the most rewarding is developing menus associated with Irish food through the Irish ages. Having the courage to say we cooked this and that, that we did not cook certain plants, fish during different time periods.

# What is the SCA Achievement so far that means the most to you?

Receiving the Honorable lady title. Why? you may ask. It's because I spend a lot of my years in the kitchen and behind the scenes, and to think that people thought enough of me to nominate me for a wide variety of awards throughout the years. To be part of a society that is interested in the quieter people in Eplaheimr even though I am not that quite. Everyone is seen and appreciated.

This award just seems to make me very proud, but in fairness any reward I have received has made me proud. Also having many different tag names such as Meadhbh of the nine cauldrons, the mammy of the island, the diplomat etc. People just express what they see in me as a person. I will finish with saying that there are few opportunities to receive rewards as an adult or be recognised for achievements but the SCA does this, helping to build confidence and life long friendships.

#### Other Business

Her Excellency Rogned Steingrimova called forth THL Meadhbh Rois inghean Uí Chaoimh and gave her a token of the Baroness' favour – HE Rogned's own Lindquistringe Ring. This was to recognise THL Meadhbh's personal service to the Baroness, but also her constant service, generosity and kindness to the populace of the Barony and the Barony itself. She was acclaimed as an example to all.

Their Excellencies dismissed their Retinue and Champions and thanked them for their service during their tenure.

#### First Court of Their Excellencies Robert and Fianna

#### Court Business

Their Excellencies invited all Baronial Officers present to swear Fealty.

The winners of the day's Tournaments were announced by the Marshal-in-charge Baron Etienne Fevre, and the Archery Marshal, Lord Kier of Eplaheimr. The Archery Shoot took the form of an Eplaheimr William Tell, where 25 points were deducted from anyone who shot the Apple, it being the primary charge of the Barony's heraldry and thus protected. Milord ÆÞelstan Weaver won the shoot and was formally asked by Their Excellencies to join their Court as Their Archery Champion, which he accepted. The Rapier Tournament was called "The Fog of War" and none of the participants were told what the criteria for winning was, or what weapon forms were to be used. Once completed, all participants were surveyed for their opinion on who was the most honourable on the field. Lord Petrc Monomachos was declared such, and therefore also the winner.

Their Excellencies then called forward Mistress Catherine Weaver and Lady Mór ni Bheag to thank them for facilitating and teaching the classes and A&S activities.

Their Excellencies took the opportunity to remind the populace of the need to put in recommendations for people who they saw doing good work.

Their Excellencies called into their Court, all newcomers present at the event, and gave them tokens, thanked them and encouraged them to continue exploring the SCA.

Their Excellencies then called into their Court Lord Brian the Courteous, who was brought forward in effigy form by the Brute Squad who were in attendance on Their Excellencies. Their Excellencies then told of how Lord Brian, formerly of the Barony, and now living in distant parts of the Kingdom, continued to serve the Barony. The currency of the Barony is the coin known as a "Core" all of which were minted by Lord Brian, who has now consented to sell his remaining stock of minted pewter cores to the Barony at just the cost of materials. He was publically thanked and acclaimed in Court.

THL Meadhbh Rois inghean Uí Chaoimh had business before Their Excellencies and was invited to speak in Their Court, whereby she brought largesse from the Lady Marina Claudia Alessandra de Grado who could not be present. This largesse was lace tokens made by her and included a personal gift to Her Excellency Fianna in the form of a pouch of traditional Clones Lace as Her Excellency hails from that town. The generosity and thoughtfulness of Lady Marina was acclaimed in Court.

Their Excellencies called Lady Kytte into Court and requested that she act as Their A&S Champion, which she accepted. They also appointed retinue by way of Baroness Melisende Fitzwalter as Their official Court Herald and Baron Etienne Fevre as Ollamh (Councillor).

Their Excellencies also called the Event Staff forward, and all who had aided them and provided service or entertainment at the event and gifted them with tokens of appreciation.

#### Feast Court

Their Excellencies briefly opened Court during Feast in order to perform the following pieces of Business:

Formally thank their predecessors Baronesses Adele de Chaddwyke and Rogned Steingrimova for their excellent service to the Barony.

To give out "The Hero's Portion" a tradition in the Barony, of gifting a cup of chose food or drink to the person at the event that had most stood out to Their Excellencies. They gifted it this time to Lady Kytte of the Lake, Event Steward, for her hard work in making the event a success.
