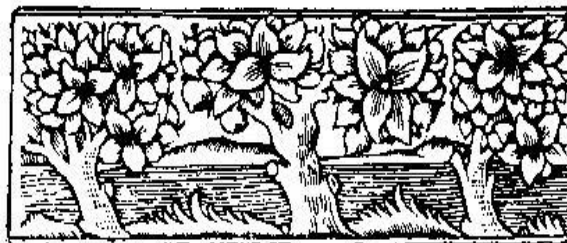

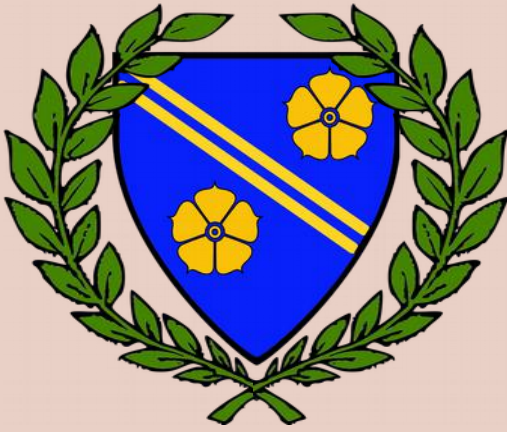

Meet Máistreás Meadhbh Rós Ingeagh Uí Chaoimh, the newest Peer in Eplaheimr and Companion of the Order of the Laurel.

Máistreás Meadhbh is the second Peer and Laurel made since Eplaheimr became a Barony. She was elevated at Strawberry Raid V in Dun in Mara. The Annals catches up with her now that she has settled into her new status.

What title have you decided to use?

I'm keeping it nice and simple and just using Máistreás, and Irish title in keeping with our Barony

Your elevation was planned as a surprise, was that a positive experience?

Yes, I decided several years ago, that I wanted it to be a surprise should it ever happen, simply because I am usually a background person, in the kitchen for example.
